## A Message From Earthwatch's CEO



I am pleased to share with you our 2019 Annual Report, although I must admit, 2019 feels like ancient history in a world besieged by the coronavirus pandemic. A global shutdown for an international

experiential learning and service nonprofit like Earthwatch is disastrous. Every week that we are forced to cancel more teams we are dealt another devastating blow to our staff, our scientists, our mission, and the hard-fought gains we've made in volunteer participation, fiscal security, and research outcomes over the last few years.

I know I'm far from alone when I say that 'this was going to be our year.' In 2019, Earthwatch launched four new expeditions, expanded our air quality monitoring throughout greater Los Angeles, grew our Girls in Science student fellowship program into a national effort, more than doubled the number of student groups who were able to participate on an Earthwatch expedition, and ended the year with a small surplus for the 4th consecutive year. Building on this momentum, we headed into 2020 with several exciting new initiatives in the works, including plans to celebrate our "golden" 50th anniversary—an incredibly proud and humbling milestone for any charitable organization.

Today, Earthwatch has had to rapidly pivot to distance learning and online engagement. We launched a new website that is capable of reaching our followers no matter what device or platform they are on, and debuted a new logo and refreshed brand that better captures the spirit of our mission. Our new "Science Matters" webinar series gives sidelined volunteers and environmental science enthusiasts the chance to stay connected virtually until we can safely reunite in person.

Although the immediate future remains uncertain, there are three things I have no doubt about: the critical need for Earthwatch's unique model of conservation and connection will still be there when the pandemic ends, Earthwatch expeditions will return, and the incredible passion and dedication of our staff and donors will carry us through this. Whether you are a first-year contributor or a fortieth, thank you for your inspiring generosity and commitment. There is no Earthwatch without invested supporters like you.


